

Vice Mayor Joseph L. Kelley

In addition to being the Spiritualleader (Pastor) of Holy Temple Missionary Baptist Church since 1989, Joseph L. Kelley has found the need to give back to his community through public service. Since 2000, he has served as a Mayor, Vice Mayor, and Commissioner. During histimein office, he has led the effort to improve the quality of life for all. Some of his accomplishments include:

- Established the SENIORS ON THE MOVE Program in 2001

In addition to this, Vice-Mayor Kelley spearheaded the effort through legislation to address the ongoing unemployment in the city. Through this legislation, which was unanimously passed by the Commission, the city hired city residents to fix sidewalks and now requires any contractor to hire city residents through an MOU agreement with the South Florida Workforce, now Career Source. After terming out in 2020, Vice Mayor Kelley was reelected in 2022 running unopposed for a commission seat to fill an expired term. Because of his valued commitment to the community, in 2024 he was reelected by voters with the highest number of votes (1,719) to a new 4-year term, currently serving as Vice Mayor. Vice Mayor Kelley is a staunch advocate for community engagement and addressing community needs while focusing on economic stability and community diversity. This is evident by his city-wide signature event, "Meet Me Monday". Vice Mayor Kelley continues to work toward making our city safer, more Parks and Recreation, senior programs, as well as smart growth

and a better quality of life for all. Along with being a Husband, Father, and Pastor, he is also a member of several religious and civic organizations and has received numerous awards and recognitions. His involvements include:
